### **Environmental:**

The Environmental Committee coordinated with our landscaping company to spread some fresh small processed stone on the entrance of the yellow trail next to big Walden pond to help with erosion and to spruce the trailhead up. Thank you to Russo and crew for a nice job!

The committee reports that our annual wildlife mammal study revealed that we are seeing a slight drop off in coyotes and red fox living in our protected woods mostly due in part to noise pollution from local businesses, small habitat loss and increased human movement on our property. It's important to remember that these wild mammals are very important to the ecosystem here and play a key role in reducing rodent population and keep the balance of nature in check. Unless you see them in the daytime staggering, wandering or acting odd, they are no threat to our residents and are part of our natural world. It can be a life-long memory to see one of our beautiful mammals in their natural habitat!

On another topic, the recent rains and snow have helped bring up the both pond levels but we are still short on water so please remember to be as water-conservative as possible and hope for the best for spring rains to bring up local reservoirs.

### **Meeting House:**

Beautifully decorated by Social & Rec. Thank you. There were 20 rentals in 2017. Between rentals, activities, council and conservancy board meetings, the MH is used on average once every week.
