## **COYOTE ALERT....AGAIN**

In case you missed the announcement, our coyote friends have returned to the community. Numerous sightings have been reported, including a very unusual one of a pack of 5 or 6 in front of the meetinghouse last month. Although not enough of a risk to humans to panic over, the coyotes are a definite threat to unprotected pets. The following news report was extracted from the WTIC NewsTalk website:

Snow cover on the ground in Connecticut makes it difficult for coyotes to find the small animals they usually eat. Avon and Canton Animal Control Officer Beverly Laplume says some cats have been disappearing in Avon, as the coyotes are turning to the next available food source, pets.

Laplume says a beagle escaped an attack from two coyotes on Tuesday when the dog's invisible fence alarm went off, startling the coyotes. A pair of coyotes also chased a golden retriever into a house in Avon.

Cats should be kept indoors, and dogs should be kept on a leash, especially in the morning.

If you see a coyote that you feel poses a threat to you, your family or pets, contact the Animal Control Division of the Windsor Police Department, 688-5273. **AND WHATEVER YOU DO, DON'T FEED THE COYOTES!!** 

### **NEW NAMES FOR RESIDENTS**

In an effort to save space in this newsletter, we're going to change how we reference residents. Village Council homeowners will now be referred to as "Villagers". Woodmoor Council homeowners will be "Woodmoorites" (better option than "Woodmoorons"). Residents in the Ridge Council will be "Ridgetarians", those in the Duplex Council will be "Duplexities" and of course there will be the "Townhomies" or "Townies" for short. Hmmmm? No, "Homies" will not be used. To be equally unfair, Villagers may occasionally be referred to as "Villageiots".

### THE BUDGET AND YOU

As we all know by now, there was some good news and not so good news in the 2009 budget approved by our Conservancy Board of Directors. The good news, of course, is that there is no increase to the Conservancy-related fees this year. They will remain at \$62 (\$63 for Woodmoor homeowners). Despite a 5% increase in landscaping and snow removal charges for 2009, that is also true for Townhome residents. Their monthly council-related fee remains at \$186 (\$248 when combined with the Conservancy fee).

The not so good news applies to the rest of the community. Village Council homeowners are now paying an extra \$25 a month because of the 5% increase in service charges and the need to replace the reserves that will be used to pay for such capital expenditures as tree pruning, shrub replacements, erosion control and stone wall maintenance in 2009.

Lumped together in the 2008 budget, the Duplex and Townhome Councils have now been separated for a more accurate allocation of expenses by unit. Because there are fewer Duplex homes (23) than Townhomes (32), each Duplex unit must now share a larger burden of paying for the expected expenses. That amounts to an additional \$17 per month.

Ridge Council homeowners are now paying \$11 more a month this year also because of the increase in service charges and some expected capital expenditures like tree pruning and shrub replacement.

The enclosed insert provides a breakdown of the 2009 budget showing how your monthly contribution is being used this year.

### PROBLEMS ON THE KNOLL

Erosion to the landscaped banks on the sides and backs of two and potentially more Knollwood North homes is threatening to cause severe damage to the driveways and foundations of those properties. Measures were taken last year to temporarily stop the erosion on two of the homes but a more permanent solution will be needed at some indeterminate time that may have an adverse impact on the Village Council budget.

The temporary measures included the use of underground p.v.c piping to discharge water from a downspout further away from the higher portion of the bank, some re-grading and the use of riprap, silt fencing and hay bales. The cost was a little under \$1,000 and was charged to the Village Council.

Elite Management has advised the Board that the permanent solutions in this area involve the construction of retaining walls, the addition of base material and more re-grading. The cost, estimated to be more than \$12,000 for each home receiving the repairs, will also be shared by all homeowners in the Village Council. Other areas on the Knoll will need attention in the future.

# SCOFF-LAWS HAVE BOARD'S ATTENTION

The Conservancy Board of Directors has announced their intention to formalize a process for collecting overdue association fees from homeowners who miss their monthly payments. At their next meeting on **Tuesday**, **February 24th**, the Board will have an open discussion of the issues involved, listen to suggestions and present a final plan of action as a motion for approval.

All homeowners are invited to attend the meeting so that they will be aware of the process to be followed and the ramifications for neglecting to pay association fees.

# STANDARDS COMMITTEE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Also on the Conservancy Board's agenda for their February 24th meeting will be the election by the board of homeowner representatives from each Council to serve on the Standards Committee. This committee helps homeowners understand and comply with the architectural and design restrictions within Walden Woods as well as overseeing compliance with our rules.
