Environmental Committee Update

The woods in our neighborhood are full of many interesting tree species, wildlife, aquatic life and ecosystem-related features. One of the Environmental Committee Co-Chairs is retired State of Connecticut Park Ranger and Walden Woods resident Glenn Brand. Glenn and the Environmental Committee are planning an interpretive nature walk on our trails so that residents can come and learn about the interesting aspects of nature and creatures that inhabit Walden Woods. During the walk, you will learn some interesting facts about our own little ecosystem here at Walden Woods, which are full of typical North American mammals, amphibians, insects, wildflowers, deciduous trees and evergreens. The date will be determined very soon.

Always keep in mind that many wild animals also call Walden Woods their home. With respect to all wildlife, please be careful when walking through the woods and trails system; especially this time of year when birds and mammals are rearing their young. Never approach a bird nest that may be inhabited by chicks or eggs. The mother may abandon the nest if she feels that the nest has been discovered. It's best to try to observe from a distance with binoculars.

We are also aware of a red fox den on the Walden Woods property and the kits should be emerging soon. Their den is a very private and sensitive area that should not be disturbed. The kits may be harmed if dogs are not leashed while on the property or on the trails, so please take this into consideration while walking with your dog and always observe the local leash laws. The red fox can also transmit rabies and therefore caution is advised if you should encounter a fox, especially during the day. Any odd behavior displayed by foxes should be reported immediately to the Windsor Police Department's K-9 Division (860-688-5273), who is best suited to handle these types of issues.

The Environmental Committee also is pleased to announce that they have an all-time high number of volunteers. Several interesting topics are on their agenda:

- Cleaning of the amphibian tunnel on Haskins Road.
- Pruning of overhanging branches on the trails.
- Inspection of the vernal ponds for possible trail loops.
- Cleaning of the spillway dam in Big Walden Pond, which is adjacent to Walden Meadow Road.
