ANNUAL REMINDERS

Winter Parking Ban: From November 15th until April 15th, <u>all</u> vehicles must be removed from public roads from Midnight to 6 a.m. every night. If you have a special function or emergency, just call the Windsor Police Department's Non-Emergency Line @ 688-5273 to avoid a fine and/or having the vehicle towed. Parking on our narrow private roads, of course, is not permitted overnight anytime during the year. This includes all Country Walk roads as well as those on the Knoll and the Ridge.

Decorations: Exterior holiday decorations must be tasteful, displayed no more than 30 days before a holiday and removed no more than 15 days after the holiday. Wreaths or door decorations are the exception and may be kept up throughout the winter season, if desired.



2007 BUDGET ALMOST READY

All homeowners are encouraged to attend the November 29th meeting of the Conservancy Board of Directors (<u>7:00PM</u> START TIME) when the 2007 Budget will be presented as the first item on the agenda. Copies of the prepared budget will be distributed and homeowners will have the opportunity to discuss line items with the board members and the Property Manager representative, Frank Goeckler.

The proposed budget will be broken down by Council and will reflect the following:

- the anticipated 2007 operating expenses (routine landscaping maintenance, snow plowing, maintenance of amenities, etc.) based on 2006 experience and anticipated utility and service increases,
- additional expenses for committee-related activity (i.e., newsletter, special landscaping needs, and social events), plus
- reserve contributions needed to cover anticipated capital expenditures for 2007 and beyond (fence replacements, meeting house repairs, road re-surfacing, etc.)

Barring unforeseen changes after the presentation, the budget will be finalized and mailed to all homeowners prior to the Annual Homeowners Meeting in December when it will be voted on for final approval and implementation.

WINE TASTING PARTY STIMULATES THE MIND AND PALATE



Thirty-Five Walden Woods homeowners attended a very informative wine tasting party held at the Meeting House on October 14th. Coordinated and hosted by the Recreation and Social Committee, the "party" took a surprising twist toward a classroom-type atmosphere when attendees became enraptured by all the information provided by wine expert Jim Nussbaum of Bert's Spirit Shop. Jim spent two hours talking and answering questions about the finer points of how to taste and judge a variety of wines. For those of you unable to attend the event, here's some of Jim's advice on the best way to taste a wine:

- 1. Hold the wine in your mouth, purse your lips and inhale gently through them. This action accelerates vaporization, intensifying the wine's aromas.
- 2. Chew the wine vigorously, sloshing it around in your mouth to draw out every last nuance of flavor.
- 3. After swallowing, exhale slowly through both your nose and mouth. The better the wine, the more complex, profound and long lasting the residual aromas will be.

Participants sampled 13 different wines, from a Port to a Pinot Noir to a Cabernet Sauvignon to a Merlot. Of special interest was the Menage A Trois wine, so named because of its blend of three kinds of grapes. Snacks, coffee and tea were served afterwards and everyone had the opportunity to order the wine(s) of their choice at discount prices. Smarter and happier, all the attendees, including Jim, were quite pleased with the event and talk has already begun about a return engagement in 2007. Cheers!

SEARCH FOR COUNCIL DIRECTORS CONTINUES

All eight Council Director positions that now compose the Conservancy Board (three from the Village Council, two from the Woodmoor, and one each from the Ridge, Duplex and Townhome Councils) will be open for election at the Annual Homeowners Meeting in December. Two incumbents from the Village Council have indicated they will not seek re-election. The newly elected Director of the Duplex Council (see below) may or may not seek re-election and, at this time, no Director has been elected for the Townhome Council. In other words, there's plenty of opportunity for any homeowner who wants to get involved in the running of our community.

Each elected Council Director will be responsible for making budget-related decisions for their applicable Council. They will also serve as their Council's representative(s) on the Conservancy Board of Directors, the governing body of Walden

Woods that makes policy, service and budgetrelated decisions affecting the entire community.
